Inside a Mezuzah
case is a parchment,
containing the first
two paragraphs of
the Shema. The
parchment is the holy
element of the
Mezuzah.

The parchment is written by a **Sofer**, a Jewish scribe.

A Mezuzah is fixed on the right hand side of the doorpost, towards the top as one enters a room.



Mezuzot belong on all doors of the house, except bathrooms or very small rooms.



(NOT ON THIS)

There is a special bracha for putting up a new Mezuzah.

A Mezuzah is a constant reminder of God's protection in our home, that our home is a place where God is welcome and where we do His mitzvot.
