Starting with 15 of his friends, they took turns in listening in to emergency calls and then responding to incidents. When they were nearby, they were able to get there in minutes and save many lives.



This concept, known as Hatzalah, took off and soon there were many local Hatzalah teams all over Israel. But Eli wasn't finished yet...



The famous Ambucycle is a motorcycle equipped with everything an ambulance has – minus the stretcher. Being a motorcycle, it never gets stuck in traffic and can stabilise life threatening situations until an ambulance arrives.
