









Purim is a holiday,

How we were saved today...




A long time ago,

Was no longer intact.




He wore the clothes,

"this must not be done!"




Some listened to Mordechai, and stayed away, But many enjoyed the party, On that very sad day.

Even on Shabbat, our special time!




Achashverosh was proud And he wanted a good show, So he told Vashti to appear, But her answer was "No!"

Mordechai was at the palace gates,


And heard everything.

And wrote it in his diary at the time.




Meanwhile, Haman became Prime Minister, He was one of the most wicked men. He told everyone to bow down to him, but Mordechai said "I only bow to Hashem."

And try to save everyone!"




But Esther could not just visit,

One had to get permission,


Before entering the king's hall.

Whilst Esther prepared for that day.




She summoned all her courage,

from the diary of days long gone.




They read about how Mordechai, saved the king's life.

I have made a mistake!"




"What do you think I should do

"What is it that you need?"




"I am asking for my people,

he'd made for Mordechai that day.




New messengers were sent,
