

My Little Yom Kippor Book




Back in shul again? The Shul is covered in white The Rabbi is singing a solemn song What is happening tonight?

She was so embarrassed to tell her caring mother Lila knew the dress was expensive and she would not buy another




She felt bad that made the stain

Because it's surface is all murky.




Hashem gave us a gift Teshuva is like a washing machine We say we are sorry and our souls become all clean

it's not just words of fluff!




To clean our souls properly, There are four steps we must take:

- 1. stop the bad behaviour
- 2. feel bad that we made a mistake
 - 3. Admit to Hashem what we did
 - 4. Decide never to do it again It's like a magic formula that brings us closer to Hashem.



Sometimes we don't even remember
What we may have done wrong
So HaShem gives us Yom Kippur
Where we fast all day long

It's not that we are sad
It's just that we are busy thinking
Looking back over the year
rather than eating and drinking.



It's such a precious day
Where we can build ourselves a new
Thinking about who we could be
A kind and faithful Jew.

You, too, can use this day to think about what you have done Do you need to ask forgiveness If you may have hurt someone?



We ask Hashem forgiveness if we forgot to follow His rules, But if we hurt someone's feelings Then we must ask them, of course.

We try to forgive other people if they were unkind to us this year and hope that Hashem will also forgive us As we quietly shed a tear.
