When they return to the UK after their gap-year hopefully they will feel more of a connection to their community and leaders and will become fully involved in their community's future.

The Chief Rabbi gave an inspiring talk to the crowd, about the importance of Israel and specifically, Jerusalem as the capital city of the Jewish People. He also spoke of the importance of continued



involvement with the Jewish community once students returned to the UK.

Rabbi Gideon Sylvester, Tribe's Israel Rabbi, also addressed attendees. The evening ended with impromptu dancing, making sure that the evening closed on a high.
