SEDER NIGHT: SUPER SEDER SPAN!



The Seder is a time for family and friends to get together. Grandparents, children, uncles, aunts, cousins and guests, all join to celebrate and remember. Sedarim may have three, four or more generations at a single Seder.

Take a Seder that is lucky enough to have a great grandparent present, who would be in their eighties or nineties. They can remember their earliest Seder, from 80 years ago.

THE FIRST SEDER IN EGYPT WAS 3,330 YEARS AGO! THAT SEEMS LIKE A REALLY LONG TIME AGO, BUT LET'S JUST STOP AND THINK ABOUT IT.



Another two

The great grandparent can describe their earliest Seder to the youngest child present. In 80 years' time, that child will have become the senior member at the Seder. They can share what their great grandparent told them when they were young. In this way they will be able to span a Seder memory bank of nearly 200 years!

Only two or three Sedarim of collective memory would take us back to Spain before the Spanish Inquisition.





Four more memory banks take us to Seder at the time of the Mishna.



Going back in this way, it doesn't take us many Sedarim to reach the very first Seder in Egypt – probably no more than 20 Sedarim of collective memory!
