MAIN PURPOSE OF JOB

- To develop youth programmes to engage young people in our Shul
- To inspire and enhance young members' connections with vibrant, authentic Jewish life
- To liaise with our rabbinical team
- To liaise with other youth workers to deliver exciting and engaging programmes for young people in our Shul
- Nurture our youth to be leaders for the next generation

MAIN ACTIVITIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Responsible for organising and running Shabbat and Yom Tov programming, including weekly Shabbat morning and Yom Tov services* for those in school years 7-13.
- Responsible for organising and running out of Shul activities trips or events including a continuation of the Shul's successful Friday Night Live events**
- To assist with the smooth running of the community's Bar and Bat Mitzvah programmes

^{*}If Youth services for either Shabbat or Yom Tov are not possible at any time due to Covid19 restrictions then the expectation would be for regular alternative davening to be arranged over Zoom or a similar platform.

^{**}All events must comply with Government and United Synagogue guidelines in connection with Covid19 and if necessary alternatives should be delivered remotely.

- Responsible for maintaining a pragmatic budget.
- To liaise regularly with line managers (and the Shul office manager as appropriate) regarding all events for the youth of the community.
- To ensure that all appropriate United Synagogue Health & Safety and Child Protection protocols have been followed for all events held either in or out of the Synagogue and all appropriate documentation is filed accordingly
