TURBO CHARGED THE SIMCHA FACTOR?

At daybreak on Succot, water would be drawn from the Shiloach Spring which would be used in the service of the Beit Hamikdash. Every night of Chol Hamoed Succot this water drawing was accompanied by the most wonderful celebration the SIMCHAT BEIT HASHOEVA.

First were the biblical floodlights! Giant golden candlesticks, each with four golden bowls for oil and four ladders. Teenage Kohanim would climb the ladders carrying oil to light the lamps. When the lamps were lit the entire Jerusalem was filled with their light.



Bring on the music and entertainment! This was the biggest party of the year... Juggling, flame throwing, singing and dancing. Thousands of people would gather to watch and participate.

The great Sage, Rabban Shimon Ben Gamliel used to juggle with EIGHT flaming torches at the Simchat Beit Hashoeva - and he never dropped a single one!



The Talmud describes the event in great detail, and tells us that the joy was so immense, that anyone who hasn't witnessed the Simchat Beit Hashoeva has not seen true happiness!
